

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Chapter 81, Montana Session Laws of 1963, provides for the extension of criminal and civil jurisdiction of the State of Montana to the extent authorized by federal law and regulations upon The Confederated Salish and Kootenai Indian Tribes; and

WHEREAS, The act requires the Proclamation of the Governor of the State when the Tribal Council has created the proper authority and requested such Proclamation from the Governor of the State; and

WHEREAS, Such proper documents have been prepared entitled "Tribal Ordinance 40-A (Revised)" under date of May 5, 1965; and

WHEREAS, Approval has been secured from the Counties of Sanders, Lake, Flathead and Missoula; and

WHEREAS, It appears all things required in Chapter 81, Montana Session Laws of 1963, have been substantially completed;

NOW, THEREFORE, By the power vested in me, as Governor of the State of Montana, I, Tim Babcock, hereby proclaim that criminal and civil jurisdiction of the State of Montana and its subdivisions does extend to The Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes as expressed in their approved Ordinance No. 40-A (Revised), and Chapter 81, Montana Session Laws of 1963, and I further declare that sixty days from the date of October 8, 1965, such criminal and civil jurisdiction as previously described shall be in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Montana to be affixed. DONE at the City of Helena, the Capital, this 8th day of October, in the year of our Lord, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-five.
