AN ACT

To add certain public-domain land in Montana to the Rocky Boy Indian May 14, 1935. [S. 613.]

Reservation. Reservation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That approximately five hundred and fifty-seven acres of public-domain land in the State of Montana, described as lots 2, 4, 6, and 8, section 25; lots Vol. 30, p. 739; Vol. 2, 4, 6, and 8, section 26; lots 2, 4, 6, and 8, section 27; lots 2, 3, and 4, 44, p. 1347.

4, 6, and 8, section 27; lots 2, 4, 6, and 8, section 28; lots 2, 4, 6, and 8, section 29, lots 5, 7, 9, and 11, section 30, township 28 north, range 16 east, of the Montana meridian, in Montana, be, and the same are hereby, withdrawn from the public domain and added to the Rocky Boy Indian Reservation: *Provided*, That the rights and claims of bona fide settlers initiated under the public-land laws prior to January 6, 1934, shall not be affected by this Act. Approved, May 14, 1935.
